Inspired by projects such as “The kindness Offensive” (which aims are to have fun, be kind and inspire as many people as possible to do the same. Performing both small and large scale Random Acts of Kindness.) or the Doublethink Project (which intentions is to gather different viewpoints of contemporary life within the realms of conceptual art, social science, and alternative and investigational approaches to cultural abstractions.)

We (collective of performance artists) want by using the format of street performance/intervention to propose a social experiment addressing different themes such as altruism, community living/support and informality as an alternative of autonomous social organization.

Our nomadic space will be created from reclaimed wood in sections, and we will attempt to carry it along a pre-determined route through areas of different social grading, with proposed stopping off points where the centre will open up. The sections of the structure and furniture will be large and heavy so as we struggle along our journey can only continue with help from passers-by. Starting like this, by eye contact and interaction with the street passers-by we want to get people involved to help us in our task of carrying and eventually after finding the right spot, setting up (illegally) a *Temporary Social Point*. This will mainly consist of random furniture and goods displayed (skipped cooked food, cloths obtained by donation and other objects meant to be given away as gifts), plus a shade chill out space where we can also offer a fresh drink and a place to seat down and talk with us about politics, art, the street, We will also create a meal for our helpers and any other people, from donated food – or what we scavenge from bins. The food and also items for the free shop will be brought to us by other performers with trailers pulled by bikes. (see picture)

As we continue on our journey around the city we would hope to inspire people to donate items or food to the space and the people with the trailers (clearly marked) will travel around each day to gather more items. We will continue the journey for as long as possible, staying in each place for a day or a few days and perhaps eventually finding a resting place where the space will become a seed and grow into a real community centre. Plus couple of bicycles with a wagon attached where we will keep some of the stuff and even bring plants.
